In order for a replacement hormone to fully replicate the function of hormones that were naturally produced and present in the human body, the chemical structure must exactly match the original.

The prevalent effect of Estriol is displayed at the skins epithelial surface. No generalized or systemic side effects have been noted and no side effects on the endometrial

uterine lining have been noted. Furthermore, Estriol is the biologically weaker estrogen; and mainly epidermotropic properties of Estriol have been described in the skin.
